FIRST AID

PRODUCT INFORMATION

TerraClean 5.0 is a soil treatment product to be used as a pre-plant application prior to or at seeding or transplanting, and as a periodic soil treatment throughout the plant's life up to the day of harvest.

TerraClean 5.0 controls the following soil borne pathogens when used as a soil treatment: *Fusarium* (root rot, leaf spot, Pink Snow Mold) - *Phytophthora* (blights, rots) – *Pythium* (root rot) – *Rhizoctonia* (blight, stem rot) – *Verticillium* (wilt).

TerraClean 5.0 works by surface contact with the soils being treated. It is important to ensure that all surfaces are thoroughly wetted and that sufficient quantities of the finished solution are applied to penetrate the soil being treated. Areas treated with TerraClean 5.0 do not need to be covered with tarps or protective plastic. TerraClean 5.0 is not a fumigant.

The performance of TerraClean 5.0 is not affected by fumigation. Use TerraClean 5.0 on fumigated and unfumigated soil.

Apply TerraClean 5.0 to the soil up to and including the day of harvest. Pre-Harvest Interval (PHI) = 0 days.

SOIL BACTERICIDE/FUNGICIDE APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

TerraClean 5.0 is compatible as a separate direct injection with many commonly used pesticides, fertilizers, adjuvants and non-ionic surfactants but has not been fully evaluated with all of these. Do not direct inject TerraClean 5.0 into the irrigation system with pesticides, surfactants or fertilizers before conducting a compatibility test to show it is physically compatible, effective and non-injurious under your use conditions. Consult your BioSafe Systems technical representative for specific instructions before mixing TerraClean 5.0 with biological based pesticides, copper or other pesticides containing metals.

To ensure compatibility, evaluate them prior to use as follows: Using a suitable container, add proportional amounts of product to water. Add wettable powders first, followed by water dispersible granules, then by liquid flowables and lastly, emulsifiable concentrates. Mix thoroughly and let stand for at least five minutes. If the combination stays mixed or can be remixed, it is physically compatible. Test the combination on a small portion of the crop to be treated to ensure that a phytotoxic response will not occur as a result of application.

PRE-PLANT SOIL TREATMENT PRIOR TO SEEDING OR TRANSPLANTING

TerraClean 5.0 may be applied as a pre-plant soil treatment prior to seeding or transplanting, or in consecutive cropping applications. Ensure that soil moisture of the beds is at or near capacity prior to TerraClean 5.0 application.

PRE-PLANT SOIL APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Field Soils to be planted to the following crops, including but not limited to: Asparagus, brassica vegetables (broccoli, cauliflower), cereal grains, cucurbit crops (cucumber, squash, melons), fruiting vegetables (e.g. eggplant, peppers, tomatoes), herbs and spices, hops, hemp, leek, leafy vegetables (lettuce), legume vege-

tables, pineapples, root and tuber

vegetables (carrot, garlic, onion,

potato, sweet potato), strawber-

ries, berries (cane fruit), fruit and

nut crops, citrus, pome fruit trees,

stone fruit trees, tree nuts, tropical

and subtropical fruits, vineyards.

TREATMENT SITE

Greenhouse Soils to be planted to the following, including but not limited to: Food and Non-food crops, hemp, flowering plants.

Pre-plant soil treatment: Cultivate the soil prior to treatment. Break-up compacted soil and clods to loosen soil completely. Apply a 1:100 dilution or 128 fl. oz. of TerraClean 5.0 per 100 gallons of setting water. Make banded or broadcast applications or, apply solution to the soil through drench, or irrigation systems such as, but not limited to drip or sprinkler at a rate of 25 to 100 gallons of solution per acre-row either prior to planting or at the time of planting. TerraClean 5.0 will not harm seedlings or plants when applied at labeled rates. In fields with a history of disease pressure, use the 100 gallons of mixed solution per acre-row rate. Following application, run irrigation system to en-

sure all solution has been flushed

from the system into the soil.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Nursery, Turf, and Ornamental Soils to be planted to the following, including but not limited to: Turf, lawns, parks, golf greens, athletic fields, recreational turf area, ornamentals, floral crops, forest tree seedlings.

Seed or Transplant beds to be planted to the following, including but not limited to: Food and Non-food crops, flowering plants.

Pre-plant soil treatment for consecutive cropping applications: Use TerraClean 5.0 when crops are grown consecutively in the same soil during a growing season. One week prior to planting new crop, apply to the soil through the irrigation system. Apply at a rate of 3-5 gallons of TerraClean 5.0 per acre in 1500-5000 gallons of water. Following application, run irrigation system to assure ensure all Terra-Clean 5.0 has been flushed from the system into the soil. TerraClean 5.0 will not harm seedlings or plants when applied at labeled rates. In fields with a history of disease pressure, use the 5 gallons per acre rate.

SOIL TREATMENT WITH ESTABLISHED PLANTS OR SEEDLINGS

Apply TerraClean 5.0 at any stage of plant growth as a soil treatment. Make applications using soil drench, flood or drip irrigation. Ensure that soil moisture of the beds is at or near capacity prior to TerraClean 5.0 application. Following application, run irrigation system to ensure all solution has been flushed from the system into the soil.

Soil Drench:

Apply 25 fl. oz. of TerraClean 5.0 per 200 gallons of water per 1000 square feet of soil to be treated.

Greenhouse Soils to be planted to the following, including but not limited to: Food and Non-food crops, hemp, flowering plants.

Nursery, Turf, and Ornamental Soils to be planted to the following, including but not limited to: Turf, lawns, parks, golf greens, athletic fields, recreational turf area, ornamentals, floral crops, forest tree seedlings.

Seed or Transplant beds to be planted to the following, including but not limited to: Food and Non-food crops, flowering plants.

Flood Irrigation:

Inject TerraClean 5.0 through a metered system using one gallon of TerraClean 5.0 per 1,000 gallons of water used.

Drip Irrigation:

Apply TerraClean 5.0 through the drip tape at an injection rate of 1:1000 (0.1% v/v) (Equivalent to 1.0-3.0 gallons per acre in 1,000-3,000 gallons of water per acre respectively) and with a 45-90 minute run time.

Apply first treatment during the first drip irrigation cycle. Make additional applications at 7-14 day interval depending on disease pressure. For fields with history of high disease pressure, consider using higher rate of 3.0 gallons per acre.

CHEMIGATION: General Requirements -

- 1. Apply this product only through a drip system or sprinkler including center pivot, lateral move, end tow, side (wheel) roll, traveler, big gun, solid set, hand move, flood (basin), furrow, border or drip (trickle) irrigation systems. Do not apply this product through any other type of irrigation system.
- 2. Crop injury, lack of effectiveness, or illegal pesticide residues in the crop can result from non-uniform distribution of treated water.
- 3. If you have questions about calibration, contact State Extension Service specialists, equipment manufacturers or other experts.
- 4. Do not connect an irrigation system (including greenhouse systems) used for pesticide application to a public water system unless the pesticide label-prescribed safety devices for public water systems are in place.
- 5. A person knowledgeable of the chemigation system and responsible for its operation, or under the supervision of the responsible person, shall shut the system down and make necessary adjustments as needed.
- 6. Posting of areas to be chemigated is required when 1) any part of a treated area is within 300 feet of sensitive areas such as residential areas, labor camps, businesses, day care centers, hospitals, in-patient clinics, nursing homes or any public areas such as schools, parks, playgrounds, or other public facilities not including public roads, or 2) when the chemigated area is open to the public such as golf courses or retail greenhouses.
- 7. Posting must conform to the following requirements. Treated areas shall be posted with signs at all usual points of entry and along likely routes of approach from the listed sensitive areas. When there are no usual points of entry, signs must be posted in the corners of the treated areas and in any other location affording maximum visibility to sensitive areas. The printed side of the sign must face away from the treated area towards the sensitive area. The signs shall be printed in English. Signs must be posted prior to application and must remain posted until foliage has dried and soil surface water has disappeared. Signs may remain in place indefinitely as long as they are composed of materials to prevent deterioration and maintain legibility for the duration of the posting period.
- 8. All words shall consist of letters at least 2.5 inches tall, and all letters and the symbol shall be a color which sharply contrasts with their immediate background. At the top of the sign shall be the words KEEP OUT, followed by an octagonal stop sign symbol at least 8 inches in diameter containing the word STOP. Below the symbol shall be the words PESTICIDES IN IRRIGATION WATER.

Specific Requirements for Chemigation Systems Connected to Public Water Systems -

- 1. Public water system means a system for the provision to the public of piped water for human consumption if such system has at least 15 service connections or regularly serves an average of at least 25 individuals daily at least 60 days out of the year.
- 2. Chemigation systems connected to public water systems must contain a functional, reduced-pressure zone, backflow preventer (RPZ) or the functional equivalent in the water supply line upstream from the point of pesticide introduction. As an option to the RPZ, the water from the public water system must be discharged into a reservoir tank prior to pesticide introduction. There shall be a complete physical break (air gap) between the outlet end of the fill pipe and the top or overflow rim of the reservoir tank of at least twice the inside diameter of the fill pipe.
- 3. The pesticide injection pipeline must contain a functional, automatic, quick-closing check valve to prevent the flow of fluid back toward the injection pump.
- 4. The pesticide injection pipeline must contain a functional, normally closed, solenoid-operated valve located on the intake side of the injection pump and connected to the system interlock to prevent fluid from being withdrawn from the supply tank when the irrigation system is either automatically or manually shut down.
- 5. The system must contain functional interlocking controls to automatically shut off the pesticide injection pump when the water pump motor stops or in cases where there is no water pump, when the water pressure decreases to the point where pesticide distribution is adversely affected.
- 6. Systems must use a metering pump, such as a positive displacement injection pump (e.g., diaphragm pump) effectively designed and constructed of materials that are compatible with pesticides and capable of being fitted with a system interlock.
- 7. Do not apply when wind speed favors drift beyond the area intended for treatment.

Specific Requirements for Sprinkler Chemigation -

- 1. The system must contain a functional check valve, vacuum relief valve and low-pressure drain appropriately located on the irrigation pipeline to prevent water source contamination from backflow.
- 2. The pesticide injection pipeline must contain a functional, automatic, quick-closing check valve to prevent the flow of fluid back toward the injection pump.
- 3. The pesticide injection pipeline must also contain a functional, normally closed, solenoid-operated valve located on the intake side of the injection pump and connected to the system interlock to prevent fluid from being withdrawn from the supply tank when the irrigation system is either automatically or manually shut down.
- 4. The system must contain functional interlocking controls to automatically shut off the pesticide injection pump when the water pump motor stops.
- 5. The irrigation line or water pump must include a functional pressure switch which will stop the water pump motor when the water pressure decreases to the point where pesticide distribution is adversely affected.
- 6. Systems must use a metering pump, such as a positive displacement injection pump (e.g., diaphragm pump) effectively designed and constructed of materials that are compatible with pesticides and capable of being filled with a system interlock.
- Do not apply when wind speed favors drift beyond the area intended for treatment.

Specific Requirements for Flood (Basin), Furrow and Border Chemigation -

- 1. Systems using a gravity flow pesticide dispensing system must meter the pesticide into the water at the head of the field and downstream of a hydraulic discontinuity such as a drop structure or weir box to decrease potential for water source contamination from backflow if water flow stops.
- 2. The systems utilizing a pressurized water and pesticide injection system must meet the following requirements:
 - a. The system must contain a functional check valve, vacuum relief

- valve and low-pressure drain appropriately located on the irrigation pipeline to prevent water source contamination from backflow.
- b. The pesticide injection pipeline must contain a functional, automatic, quick-closing check valve to prevent the flow of fluid back toward the injection pump.
- c. The pesticide injection pipeline must also contain a functional, normally closed, solenoid-operated valve located on the intake side of the injection pump and connected to the system interlock to prevent fluid from being withdrawn from the supply tank when the irrigation system is either automatically or manually shut down.
- d. The system must contain functional interlocking controls to automatically shut off the pesticide injection pump when the water pump motor stops.
- e. The irrigation line or water pump must include a functional pressure switch which will stop the water pump motor when the water pressure decreases to the point where pesticide distribution is adversely affected.
- f. Systems must use a metering pump, such as a positive displacement injection pump (e.g., diaphragm pump) effectively designed and constructed of materials that are compatible with pesticides and capable of being filled with a system interlock.

Specific Requirements for Drip (Trickle) Chemigation -

- 1. The system must contain a functional check valve, a vacuum relief valve and low-pressure drain appropriately located on the irrigation pipeline to prevent water source contamination from backflow.
- 2. The pesticide injection pipeline must contain a functional, automatic, quick-closing check valve to prevent the flow of fluid back toward the injection pump.
- 3. The pesticide injection pipeline must also contain a functional, normally closed, solenoid-operated valve located on the intake side of the injection pump and connected to the system interlock to prevent fluid from being withdrawn from the supply tank when the irrigation system is either automatically or manually shut down.
- 4. The system must contain functional interlocking controls to automatically shut off the pesticide injection pump when the water pump motor stops.
- 5. The irrigation line or water pump must include a functional pressure switch which will stop the water pump motor when the water pressure decreases to the point where pesticide distribution is adversely affected.
- 6. Systems must use a metering pump, such as a positive displacement injection pump (e.g., diaphragm pump) effectively designed and constructed of materials that are compatible with pesticides and capable of being filled with a system interlock.

Application Instructions -

- 1. Remove scale, pesticide residues, and other foreign matter from the chemical supply tank and entire injector system. Flush with clean water until no scale or pesticide residues are present. Failure to provide a clean tank, void of scale or residues may cause product to lose effectiveness or strength.
- 2. Determine the treatment rates as indicated in the directions for use and make proper dilutions.
- 3. Prepare a solution in the chemical tank by filling the tank with the required amount of water and then adding product as required. TerraClean 5.0 may be direct injected from the original container. The product will immediately go into suspension without any agitation.
- 4. TerraClean 5.0 may be applied in conjunction with other pesticides or fertilizers. For injection of TerraClean 5.0 with metal-based fungicides and biological based pesticides consult your BioSafe Systems technical representative for specific instructions.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store in original container in a cool, dry well-vented area, away from direct sunlight. Do not allow product to become overheated in storage. Do not store in a manner where cross-contamination with other pesticides or fertilizers could occur.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling if available or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration. Do not burn, unless allowed by state and local ordinances. If burned, stay out of smoke.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: (Containers greater than 5 gallons): Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Triple rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container ¼ full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling if available or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration. Do not burn, unless allowed by state and local ordinances. If burned, stay out of smoke.
